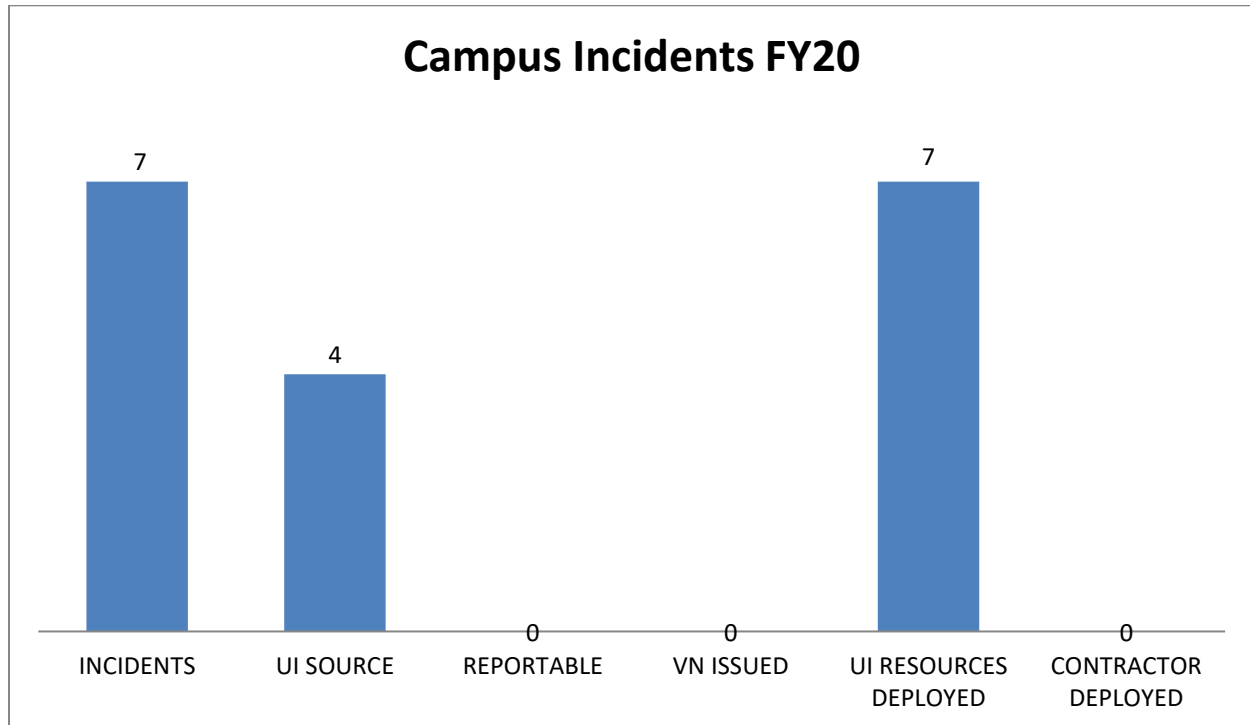


# Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures (SPCC) Program

GOAL: Minimize the quantity and severity of accidental spills through annual training.



**Incidents** Unauthorized release of a substance to the air, land, or water.

**UI Source** Indicates if the University was the source of the spill.

**Reportable** Quantity of substance released requires notifying regulatory agencies.

**VN Issued** Indicates whether a violation notice for an unauthorized release was issued to the University.

**UI Resources Deployed** Indicates whether University resources were necessary to address the release. This includes materials, equipment, and shop labor, but not compliance staff labor (which is generally used on all incidents for investigation).

**Contractor Deployed** Indicates whether an emergency response contractor was engaged to respond to the incident.

- During FY20, 12 of 14 employees requiring annual SPCC 'Train the Trainer' refresher training were trained.
- Units receiving training include: F&S, Housing, and Willard Airport.
- University resources were deployed to clean up 7 of the 7 incidents (100%).
- All releases were small enough and/or adequately contained so as to not require notifying regulatory agencies.
- Most common types of spills include: petroleum products or turbidity in the Boneyard Creek.
- No violation notices (VN) were issued for these incidents.
